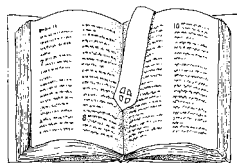

28th Sunday in Ordinary Time—October 14

There seemed to be no hope for Naaman, a leper and a foreigner in a strange land. Absurd as it seemed, Naaman acted on the prophet's word to plunge into the muddy Jordan River to be made clean. When he emerged from the water, Naaman received more than physical healing. He received faith in God's saving power. God makes salvation known to all peoples, even to the ends of the earth.

Acting on God's word was a way of life for Paul. Imprisoned in chains, he freely proclaimed that those who died with Christ in baptism would be raised to new life. The same power that raised Jesus from the dead is at work in us. Like Naaman, we come to the water filled with the leprosy of sin. We cry, "Jesus, master, have pity on us," and he heals us, expelling evil from our lives. Washed in the waters of salvation, we sit at table with the household of faith. Jesus tells us, "Stand up and go your way; your faith has been your salvation." Now we must share it with others.

For Reflection: In what ways do I live my baptismal promises? Do I share what God has done for me?
