A mother and her seven sons serve as noble examples of innocent people who suffer torture or death at the hand of evil people. These martyrs resisted those who tried to make them give up their beliefs, and they remained faithful to God to the end. Before each one's death, they made a declaration of faith in God and in the hope of being restored to life.

Jesus suffered the fate of all who are unjustly wronged by the powers of the world. When those who wanted to put him to death tried to make his teaching on the resurrection look absurd. Jesus told them that they were the ones who were foolish. God in not the God of the dead. All who believe in God are alive
