PERIODIC REVIEW CHECKLIST

- Take a few moments to write down your goals as well as names of the people and institutions you hold dear and that you want to provide for.
- If you have a current will, review it to see if your goals and intentions are still the same.
- Write a "laundry list" of personal items, possessions, and furnishings.
- Designate any possessions that you intend for certain heirs, relatives, or friends.
- Tally the value of your home, stocks, bonds, real estate, retirement plans, insurance policies, investments, farmland, livestock, cash, and collectibles.
- Inform your loved ones when you plan or revise your will.

IMPORTANT CONSIDERATIONS

Charitable "bequests" in many wills can actually lower the amount of Estate Tax to be paid. It is just like a deduction on your Income Tax before the final tax bill is computed.

Your Estate Plan should also consider gifts to "children, church, and charity" which would move assets out of your taxable estate that you might have planned to give in the future anyway. Check with an attorney as you consider these plans.

VISIT AN ATTORNEY

It is essential that your Estate Planning and any Charitable Bequests be done properly, professionally, and legally. An attorney who is experienced in the areas of estate, tax, and trusts should be used to implement your wishes. Remember, most attorneys specialize in areas such as litigation, bankruptcy, personal injury, etc. Therefore, you should make sure to select an attorney who can meet your needs in these important areas of Estate and Tax Law. *(to be continued)*
