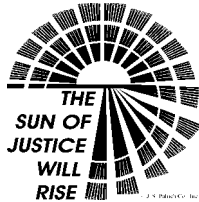

33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time, November 18

“The Lord comes to rule the earth with justice,” the psalmist proclaimed, filling hearts with faith and hope. Some did not see the coming “Day of the Lord” in such glowing terms. Rather it would be one of dread, a blazing oven of God’s wrath setting afire all proud evildoers. Yet for those who feared God, “the sun of justice would arise with its healing rays.”

Paul admonished those who idly waited for God to take them to heaven. Paul urged them to follow his example of diligently proclaiming the gospel, laboring to the point of exhaustion so as not to be a burden to anyone. If the kingdom was to come, there was work to be done in the here and now.

Jesus warned his followers not to waste time in useless speculation of the end. Nor must they be misled by false prophets promising peace. War, rebellion, and natural disasters would occur in every generation. Dissension would tear apart families and friends. Jesus encouraged them to have faith. His words of wisdom would be their defense against the adversary. By patient endurance they would be saved.

For Reflection: Is the gospel that I proclaim really good news? If I were tried because of my faith, would there be enough evidence to convict me?

A SPECIAL DAY

The Lord’s Day—as Sunday was called from Apostolic times—has always been accorded special attention in the history of the Church because of its close connection with the very core of the Christian mystery.

WORDS TO LIVE BY

We keep Sunday holy because on this day, we re-celebrate the Easter mysteries! Indeed, Sunday recalls the resurrection itself. Week by week, we return to this marvelous mystery of our faith. Like those two disciples on their way to Emmaus, the ones who felt their hearts burning within them as they came to understand the faith, so we likewise have the opportunity each week to experience the presence of the Risen Christ. We have the chance to sit at his feet in the Liturgy of the Word, and then to share in His very own supper! As Eusebius of Alexandria said in one of his sermons, “the Lord’s day” is “the lord of days.” Indeed!

FOR REFLECTION

Think back to how you spent last Sunday. How much of the day was devoted to the Lord? In what ways did your observance of this day increase your awareness of God? Was it for “the lord of days”?

Take a small step next Sunday. Find one way to keep it as a personal “holy day” for you and those in your household.

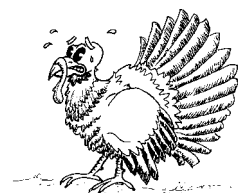
