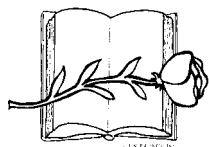

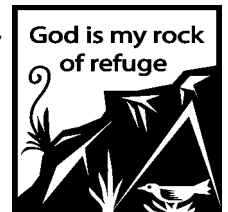

ST. CATHERINE C.C.W. MEETING: Sunday, November 19 after mass. All ladies of the parish are welcome.

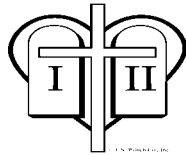
