DON'T OVERLOOK PENANCE THIS LENT

"One of the things that I have noticed as I go around this great and expansive archdiocese is the longing of human hearts for an encounter with the living God.

Last Sunday, I had the privilege of presiding at the Sunday liturgy for the community of St. Lawrence-Newman parish in Minneapolis on the 150th anniversary of the foundation of the Paulist Fathers (who came to our archdiocese in 1917).

Sorry for our sins - In that context, I witnessed the second scrutiny of the catechumens and candidates in their Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. Appropriately, I was able to make a connection between their conversion and the ongoing Lenten conversion of us who are already baptized. I emphasized how the external works of Lent are meant to bring us to a greater contrition for sin and then lead us to confess that sin to a priest, receiving individual absolution.

In this context, I wish to applaud our priests, who in this busy season make time to celebrate this wonderful sacrament by hearing confessions as Archbishop Harry Flynn instructed us to do at last summer's convocation. (Please read Archbishop Flynn's "Pastoral Letter on Penance" at www.ARCHSPM.ORG/HTML/Pastoral 2.HTML).

Auricular (spoken) confession is the ordinary (i.e. normal) form of sacrament as called for by the universal teaching of our church. In every instance in the New Testament where Jesus offers the forgiveness of sins, it is a one-on-one gift to a particular individual.

On the day of his resurrection, Jesus gave his Apostles the power to "bind and loose" sins. This presumes they already had heard what it was that they would eventually "bind or loose."

The practice of auricular confession of sin goes back to the earliest centuries of the church as verified by the Didache (around 70 A.D.), and the writing of Tertullian (203 A.D.), Hippolytus (215 A.D.) and St. John Chryysostom (387 A.D.).

Taking ownership - There is another very important psychological and spiritual element in a spoken confession: It forces me to own my sin as my own.

We know from Alcoholics Anonymous that true healing of the disease only begins when one can admit to another, "I am an alcoholic." Something liberating happens with such an admission.

The same is true in the spiritual realm. As human beings, we can often rationalize all kinds of activity as being just and proper (i.e. "she started it," "I couldn't help it," "the devil made me do it").

We don't like to admit that what we did was wrong, and we don't like to ask for forgiveness. But, by owning my sin in a sacramental confession of my faults, I come in direct contact with Christ's divine mercy, which heals and renews the soul.

Preparing ourselves - The season of Lent is one of the most appropriate time to prepare ourselves to celebrate the sacrament of penance/reconciliation by confessing our sins to a priest and receiving individual absolution.

Pope Benedict XVI stated at his general audience on Feb. 6 that Lent "helps us to rediscover the gift of faith we received at baptism and encourages us to approach the sacrament of reconciliation, placing our commitment to inner conversion under the protection of divine mercy."

Having taught the penance practicum for priesthood candidates at Detroit's major seminary for 13 years, I have developed a deep appreciation for this sacrament and its being celebrated according to the mind of the church.

I also find great satisfaction during parish visits when I am able to hear confessions. I find people speak to the priest as they would speak to God and, as a priest, that is a sacred trust.

I hope all our priests feel the same way. I truly believe with all my heart that the practice of auricular confession with individual absolution is, and will continue to be, a source of tremendous spiritual growth for penitent and confessor alike. God bless you!
