

## FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

(continued from last week)

"Look at all the good that would come from that. Everyone now knows about him, and now there is suddenly this miracle, this cure"; and it really made great sense, but I also had to remember that even when I got down to the very bottom of my heart as a priest, I had to say there is something underneath that. There is something actually infinitely underneath, and that is God Himself, and He always knows best. For you see He has a different perspective than we have. We can only see what is in front of us, or what would make sense to us; but He sees through time, and through eternity, and through darkness. He sees the effects that everything can have on other things. He sees what we can't see, and that is why in the end we have to say, "Not my will but your will be done."

For God always answers our prayers, and sometimes He does say no, but only because He is saying, "I have something better, something that you can't see, and don't worry." God never holds back something that is good from us. He only gives what is good to us, and that is where, at a time when we may ask those questions, we have to remember the perspective that He has. It is one that is higher and above us; He sees all things, and that is the kind of perspective Zach was able to gain too from his suffering: to think eternally, not just in time.

As he said in the beautiful video, My Last Days, every teenager feels invincible, that we can't be conquered, even if we won't admit that. We think that we have all the time in the world, but we really don't; and what really matters is eternity, for that never goes away. It never ends, and it is there that we really are meant to be.

He gives each of us some time in this world; for some it is a lot and for others not so much, but still we need to use that talent that God gave us to bring as much grace into the world as we can, starting with ourselves; and he was able literally to do that, to bring grace into the world; not just here in our own community, but all over the world; he brought in such great light in the darkest times in people's lives. You just need to start reading a few of the things that people have written from all over the world. We see just how much is really there.

Just last night I received an email from someone, I don't know. It says, "I'm Jeffrey Trigger and I teach 6th graders in Fredericksburg, Virginia. I watched the video about Zach yesterday. I decided that my students needed to see this. Even though Zach is no longer with us, he touched the lives of 80 people today. He gives us all hope. Please tell the family thank you for inspiring me and others to live a



little more patiently, happily, and empathetically. He truly did make the world a little better."

I think we could go on and on just quoting different people, but especially what was important was how he touched the lives of people who were in a very dark place, in ways that he never even intended; his song, Clouds, which so remarkably is the #1 song on iTunes is the main way that he did this, but so too did his honesty in My Last Days. The director of the video said, "all that was happening was not because he was dying, but because of the way that he was living." And so he lived that short life so very well. He touched those people in darkness, and the way he did it was by giving them hope.
