FROM THE PASTOR

2022 Synod Report:

The 2022 Synod, only the second one in the history of the Minneapolis-St. Paul Diocese, was a once in our lifetime experience. A synod is a consultation process that the Church gives as a tool for a bishop to be able to discover what the faithful and others think about particular topics. Archbishop Hebda wants to use a synod to identify pastoral priorities that can direct the Church in the coming years. The Synod gathering was the culmination of over four years where Archbishop Bernard Hebda desired to listen and develop a Pastoral Plan to move the Archdiocese into the future. Five hundred Catholics gathered, with Deloris Friske, David Nelson and Rosie Nelson representing St. Catherine and St. Patrick parishes. We attended along with clergy, religious, and young Catholics in prayer and discussion over a 3-day period. Three masses invoking the guidance of the Holy Spirit were joyful, well attended, and very meaningful.

Parishes in both urban and rural areas shared concerns that emerged into the 40 topics reflected upon. The Synod participants, under the guidance of the Holy Spirit, discerned about the 40 topics under the headings of evangelization, life-long formation, and youth/young adult. Some of the proposals were to focus more on the true presence of the Eucharist, adult faith formation, small groups, and to be more welcoming.

The 7 Topics chosen out of 40 Topics proposed to the Archdiocese through this Synod process were: Adult Formation, Small Groups, Education for the Mass, Parents as Primary Educators, Vibrant Youth Ministry, Welcome and Hospitality, and Regional/Deanery Cooperation.

The domestic Church, the family, was a recurring theme in all three focus areas. Within these focus areas, we looked at finding ways within our community for parents, singles, and young adults to have a concrete and faith-based understanding of the teachings of Jesus in the liturgy and through the outreach of the Catholic Church. The future the church will be authentic and true to the message of Jesus Christ and the Apostles.
