Festival Spotlight: RAFFLE TICKETS

The Raffle ticket sales are the biggest money maker for the festival each year. Ron and Kathy McBroom have been the chairs of this area for over ten years now. According to Ron, "You do not want to deprive your loved ones of winning the big money" and "There is no human being that should NOT be allowed the privilege of owning a St. Patrick Festival raffle ticket". Each year we print out 6,000 tickets that need to be sold. Each parish family is asked to sell 2 books of 10 tickets each. Obviously we have many that sell much more than that because we usually sell out of tickets. Also, if a parishioner sells 10 or more books they receive a \$20 gift certificate from St. Patrick's Bar & Grill. There are 10 prizes given away ranging from \$50-\$500. Our total profit each year is around \$10,000. Helpful hints to sell these tickets are to carry them with you everywhere you go and ask everyone if they would like to purchase one ticket or one book. Remember to ask all your family members, friends, and co-workers. Sending a mass e-mail to everyone in your address book is another great way to get people to buy the tickets. 10 Things That Make for a Great Catholic Mom

7. Let Go (Proverbs 22:6)

The hardest and most heart-wrenching task of motherhood is letting our children go. The bond of motherhood is so deep that it is tempting to hold on to our babies long after they have grown. And yet we believe that our children are a gift from God who will one day be sent into the world to be a gift to others. It is helpful to remember that the goal of motherhood is not to smother our children with attention; rather it is to prepare them to be happy, healthy, faith-filled individuals. At times this may mean stepping back and allowing our kids to face the consequences of their actions or encouraging them to sort out a school homework assignment on their own. Sometimes letting go is the best love we can give.
