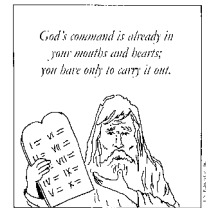

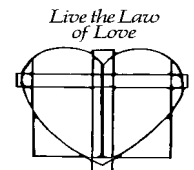

## ***10 Things That Make for a Great Catholic Mom***

### **9. Share and Share Alike (Luke 3:10-14)**

When our kids are little, one of the first lessons we try to instill in them is sharing. By preschool, many kids are pretty good at sharing, and we switch our focus to teaching other skills. But the truth is that even for adults, sharing is not easy. We moms can be great models of sharing by including our kids in clean-out donation efforts. It is important to cultivate a spirit of giving that encourages sharing our material goods, money, and time with people who are struggling or less fortunate. Some ideas: When a new toy comes in, choose an old one to give away. Donate old school clothes to a homeless shelter before buying new clothes in the fall. Talk about how much is "enough". Do we need ten pairs of jeans—or would we be okay with five?
