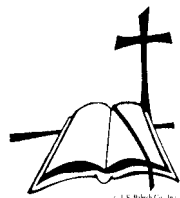

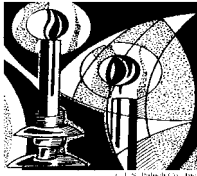

15th Sunday in Ordinary Time—July 15

God is not remote and uncaring. God isn't up in the sky or across the sea, mysterious and unattainable. God is very near to those who call. When we turn to God in times of trouble, our prayers will be heard and help will come. Jesus announced that God's reign was close at hand. Jesus was God's wisdom, love, and mercy incarnate. In him, the invisible became the visible. Though the powers of evil dominated the earth, through Jesus, God reconciled the world, and God's peace was restored.

Are we willing to hear God's truth? Can we love God with everything that we possess—heart, soul, mind, and strength? Can we love our neighbors in the same way that we love ourselves? "Who is my neighbor?" we ask. Jesus said that our neighbor is the person right next to us, in our homes and on our streets. Our neighbor is the one we fail to see on our way to do good and holy things. Our neighbor is the one who falls victim to violence, neglect, and abuse. When we open our eyes we will see the wounded Christ in those we meet. Then all of humanity will be neighbor to us.

For Reflection: Have I responded with God's care to someone in need today? Who has been neighbor to me in my needs?
