FESTIVAL CLEAN-UP: Sunday, July 23rd after the festival and Monday, July 24th at 9:00 AM. Everyone is welcome!

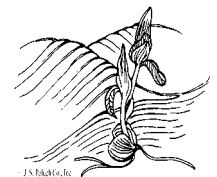

CHURCH BELLS

Long ago, church bells were rung far more often than today. They indicated the time, warned of fire or other dangers, and even announced whether the baby just born to the queen was a boy or a girl. (A different number of rings was used.) Of course, they also called the congregation to church, and that's often the only purpose they are used for today.

One thing that is the same for bells of any time is that someone must ring them. As loud as a bell can be, it will not be heard unless someone takes the time to pull its rope.

In the same way, as powerful as is the Bible's message, it will not be heard unless people take the time to teach it (in Sunday school and elsewhere), sing it (in choir and elsewhere), and live it (everywhere)!

So somewhere in your schedule, find time to bring God's message of hope to those who need it.
