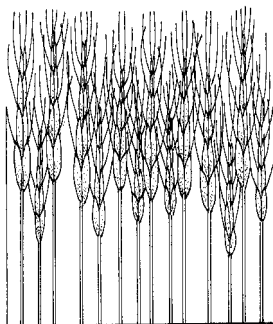

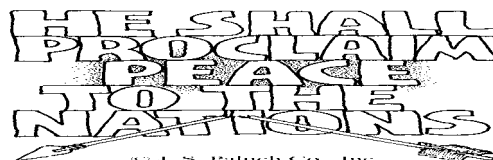

Many forms of prayer

Prayer is simply turning to God. When it comes to personal prayer, it's important to find a style that appeals to you. Fortunately, Catholicism offers a multitude of ways to pray. Here are three of the most common.

Praying the Lord's Prayer. The Lord's Prayer is what Jesus gave to his disciples when they asked him, "Lord, teach us to pray." The first words of the prayer reflect the intimate way that Jesus addressed God: "Dear Father." By teaching his disciples to call on God in the same way, he invites us to have the same closeness with God. Since we share this closeness, we say, *our Father*. The prayer continues by acknowledging and surrendering to God's intentions for the world and then asks God to respond to our human needs.

Praying with scripture. You can pray by using any of your favorite stories or passages from the Bible. Once you've turned to the passage, ask for God's help in making its message a part of your life, and then read the passage. Read it again as slowly as you can, noticing the parts that speak to you. Reflect on what has struck you—the story or an image or maybe even one word—and talk with God about its significance in your life.

Praying the rosary. The prayers of the rosary are imaginative meditations on the mysteries of the lives of Jesus and Mary. For many years the decades of the rosary focused on 15 mysteries, but now there are 20 mysteries; Pope John Paul II recently included 5 additional "mysteries of light."
