**THANK YOU:** To Al Stepka for supplying the sand for the new shed at no charge. Thanks also, to Mike Ryan for his hard work on the shed project.

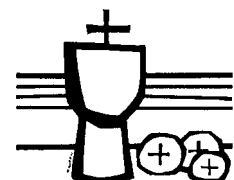

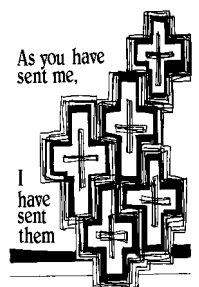

### **PARISH NURSE PROGRAM:**

The Minnesota visiting nurse associate does not encourage the use of microwaves to heat liquids and food for infants. There is a risk of overheating formulas and food which can severely burn the infant or child's mouth and throat. Microwave plastic bottles or containers can cause the release of toxins present in the plastic and can be transferred to food, milk, and the atmosphere. Also improper heating can cause an explosion.
