8. Admit Imperfections (James 5:16)

None of us is perfect, and nowhere is this more evident than in motherhood. Even the best moms lose their tempers, make mistakes, and run out of patience. And we all feel guilty for doing so! Yet if we allow ourselves to be fully human rather than trying to live up to some unrealistic standard of perfection, we are able to parent with a great sense of understanding, forgiveness, and compassion. Acknowledging our mistakes and imperfections—to our children, our spouse, even our neighbors or coworkers—helps us remember that we’re all in need of Christ’s redemption. We are all sinners. We are all just trying to do the best we can.
