PARISH NURSE PROGRAM:

Forms of Complementary Therapies that can "support" your physical, mental, and spiritual health.

IMAGERY: Focusing on something other than what is happening. It is used to manage pain, stress, and fears. Some suggest it boosts the immune system. It helps in relaxation and is often used in preparing for medical procedures. ACCUPRESSURE: It's applied with pressure from the fingers (no needles) on specific points of energy pathways that cross our body. It has been used for headaches, nausea, pain relief, improving one's appetite, and to increase one's circulation.
